About the course

The A1.2 course is designed for literate children between 8 and 10 years who have completed A1.1 course.

In 6 modules, children will continue learning basic German. Each module lasts 4 weeks (40mins/week) and can be booked separately.

The course outline is based on the structure of a book for German as a foreign language.

MODULE 7

Describing your home and giving directions.

MODULE 8

Speaking about the weekly plan and school subjects, being able to buy things in German.

Reading the time and speaking about daily routines, expressing needs and wishes.

MODULE 10

Speaking about the birthday, being able to read dates.

MODULE 11

Describing animals, being able to form questions.

MODULE 12

Speaking about the months of the year, describing and planning holidays.


OFFICIAL GERMAN EXAM

After having completed courses A1.1 and A1.2, children should have reached German level A1 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Children above 10 years can take an official German exam at a recognized institute (e.g. Goethe).

FURTHER GERMAN LEVELS

The A1 level (elementary level) is followed by A2 level. Courses are planned in the future.



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
